

Guide To Conducting a SWOT Analysis for SOGI Data Collection

Identifying strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) related to SOGI data collection can be helpful in developing a SOGI data collection plan. Strategies and action plans can maximize strengths, address weaknesses, capitalize on opportunities, and mitigate threats. In this process, it is feasible to assess specific components of the overall data collection efforts to ensure success of this activity. For example, a SWOT analysis can help refine data collection protocols, secure additional resources, or partnerships, and implement training programs to build staff capacity on LGBTQI+ issues. Monitoring and evaluation of the data collection process is also important to ensure sustainability of efforts.



STRENGTHS

- Identify internal strengths that can facilitate SOGI data collection, such as expertise within the organization on LGBTQI+ issues, existing data collection infrastructure, or strong partnerships with LGBTQI+ community organizations.
- Assess internal resources that can support the data collection process, including funding, staff expertise, and technology infrastructure.
- Consider any unique advantages your organization or project may have in collecting SOGI data, such as a supportive leadership or a history of successful data collection efforts.



WEAKNESSES

OPPORTUNITIES
